TREASURER'S REPORT

Global Ties Iowa emerged from the pandemic years in stable financial position, and short-term funding remains stable as the Community Partnership Grant (CPG) through the U.S. State Department provides core funding. Historically, CPG funding levels depend on the number of programs and visitors GT IA hosts during a given year, but the State Department froze funding levels during the pandemic years and for one more fiscal year allowing GT IA to experience financial stability during uncertain times. Nonetheless, the Board recognized this core funding would once again become dependent on the number of visitors and programs completed during a year, and so resources were devoted towards that goal this year. The increase in expenses, a direct result of working towards that goal, was aided by grant funds received prior to this fiscal year. Current year CPG funding (2022) is not reflected in income as these funds have not yet been disbursed.


Prior investment in technology and continued support this year allowed Global Ties Iowa to complete multiple virtual programs. The same technology was used for communications and membership initiatives as well. A mid-year CPG funding increase allowed the Board to boost staffing, as well as match inflationary pressures, ultimately positioning the organization to handle inperson programming again and increase capacity to host visitors and attract new programming. The return of the Mandela Washington Fellowship this summer resulted in fee-for-service income which had been lost income due to the pandemic.

Your membership and donations, through the uncertainty of the past several years, reminds us Global Ties Iowa is comprised of a wonderful community of people that believe in citizen diplomacy and long to see our visitors succeed. Thank you for your support.


Financial Position as of Sept 30, 2022 \$131,024
