

Amazing Alumni

Each year, alumni of U.S. State Department exchange programs (IVLP) receive prestigious honors and attain positions of prominence all around the world. In recognition of these accomplishments, the list below highlights some of the top alumni achievers of 2012. Eight alumni became heads of state:

- President of the Dominican Republic Danilo Medina (IVLP 1991)
- President of Finland Sauli Niinistö (IVLP 1992)
- President of Germany Joachim Gauck (IVLP 1993)
- Prime Minister of Jamaica Portia Simpson-Miller (IVLP 1981)
- President of Malawi Joyce Banda (IVLP 1989)
- President of Moldova Nicolae Timofti (IVLP 2005)
- Prime Minister of Slovakia Robert Fico (IVLP 2002)
- President of Slovenia Borut Pahor (IVLP 1991)

In addition to these eight heads of state, more than 100 alumni assumed offices in cabinets or senior government positions worldwide. More than 20 alumni received honors including:

- Chinese International Writing Program Alumnus Mo Yan who was awarded the Nobel Prize in Literature
- Tajikistan Sports United Alumna Mavzuna Chorieva who received a bronze medal at London 2012 Olympic Games
- United Kingdom Fulbright Alumnus John B. Gurdon who was awarded the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine.



Zimbabwe Calling

Battle lines drawn ahead of Wednesday polls

The stage is set for a battle as Zimbabwe gears up for Wednesday's historic elections between ZANU PF's long time ruler Robert Mugabe and his rival Morgan Tsvangirai, leader of the MDC-T.

The harmonized elections will be the first to be held under the new constitutional dispensation that limits the President's time in office to two terms of five years.

On Tuesday, Mugabe told a live televised press conference that he will accept defeat and stand down if he loses the election.

'If you lose you must surrender to those who would have won. We will do so to comply with the rules. If you go into the process where there are only two outcomes, you either win or lose,' he said.

It remains to be seen if he will abide by this statement.

"I am hopeful that this election is going to change my life and those of any ordinary Zimbabwean. Our country used to be the breadbasket of Africa but this is no longer the situation. I believe we need a change of this government to pave way for a new ruler and a new generation of leadership. We need democracy in Africa and one man cannot rule for 33 years! I have strong feelings that Morgan Tsvangirai is going to win. His victory means a lot in my life."

Thanks to a grant provided by NCIV, Executive Director Robyn Braverman and Board Member Martha Greer attended Network D.C., a program sponsored by NCIV that brings local organizations such as CIVIC to Washington D.C. to meet with representatives of the US Department of State, the affiliated programming agencies, and representatives from other local organizations. In meetings over a three-day period in early July, Martha and Robyn presented a resource presentation highlighting five key areas in which eastern Iowa is uniquely positioned to provide international visitors a quality experience: Education; Health Care; Agriculture; Arts, Culture and the Humanities; and Government. Learning more about the priorities of both the programming agencies and the US Department of State was invaluable to CIVIC, and judging by the number of visits scheduled immediately following the trip, the trip was a great success for CIVIC.

Dear CIVIC Members,

We have been very busy since our last newsletter, having received distinguished visitors from Mongolia, Algeria, Turkmenistan, Zimbabwe, and a multi-country visit which included representatives from Yemen, Qatar, Palestine, Tunisia, Algeria, and Jordan!

One additional visit we had that I'd like to highlight briefly for you was a multi-country group of highly distinguished government officials who came to learn about US Foreign Policy. During that visit, CIVIC volunteers were able to meet and engage with (1) a Foreign and Security Affairs Adviser to the President of Spain, (2) the Head of the Strategic Policies, Analysis, and Prognosis Unit in the office of the President of Bulgaria, (3) the Deputy Director of the Americas Department in Kuwait's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, (4) the Assistant to the Under-Secretary of High School Education in Mexico, (5) a rising young female Political Officer of the African Union Commission; and (6) a Senior China Reporter for the South China Morning Post.
